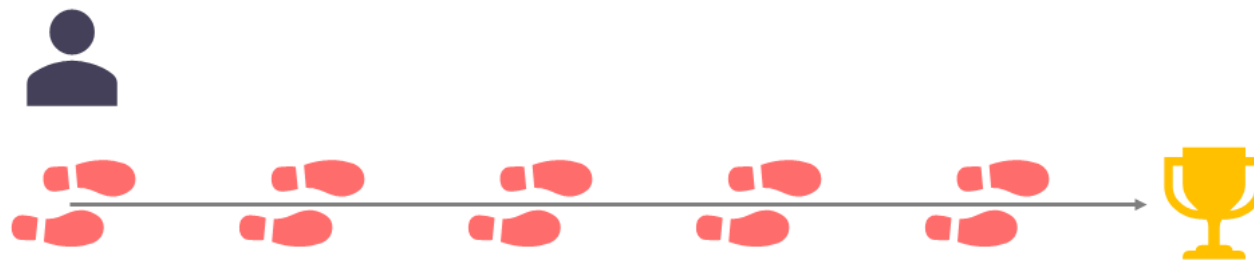

# Learning Paths

- A learning path is a sequence of steps that lead students to a goal.
- A teacher can add resources and tasks to a learning path for a student to follow. The same goal can have different paths.
- After completing a step, students go on to the next.
- This enables students on different levels to reach the same goal at their own pace.


# Learning paths can be created in two ways:

1. From scratch
2. Turning a folder into a learning path




# Creating a Learning Path from scratch

- Suitable when you have all the necessary content in the course, the library or on your computer.
- Create each step by adding a resource.
- Add as many steps as you want.
- For activities that can be assessed, branches based on outcome can be created.



# Creating a Learning Path from a folder

- If you have to create content, it's best to make a folder first, & then turn it into a Learning Path
- A step is created for each resource in the folder – drag & drop to reorder
- Resources can be added to the path if needed
- By default, all steps will allow the student to move to the next step when completed
